SASKATCHEWAN ANNOUNCES INVESTMENT OF \$1 MILLION TO PROMOTE CAREERS IN THE HOSPITALITY SECTOR



The Government of Saskatchewan has announced support of \$1 million to Hospitality Saskatchewan to help them promote careers in Saskatchewan's hospitality and tourism sector. Saskatchewan's hospitality sector, like many other jurisdictions in North America, was one of the first and hardest hit by the global pandemic over the past two years, resulting in a labour shortage in the province.

"The hospitality and tourism sector is driven by small and medium-sized businesses that are at the heart of Saskatchewan's economy," Immigration and Career Training Minister Jeremy Harrison said. "This \$1 million investment, along with other programs like the recently launched Hard-To-Fill Skills Pilot and the Re-Skill Saskatchewan Training Subsidy, will assist in attracting, training and retaining employees needed to accelerate recovery of the hospitality sector."

GOVERNMENT INCREASES COMMITMENT TO SUPPORTING STROKE AWARENESS CAMPAIGN



Stroke Campaign Urges Saskatchewan Residents To Recognize Signs And Act FAST (Face - Is It Drooping; Arms - Can You Raise Both; Speech - Is It Slurred Or Jumbled; Time To Call 911)

The Government of Saskatchewan is providing funding of \$75,000 to the Heart and Stroke Foundation toward their FAST public awareness campaign, an increase of \$25,000 from previous years.

"The FAST campaign is critical to raising awareness around the importance of identifying signs of a stroke and what to do promptly if you are experiencing symptoms," Health Minister Paul Merriman said. "Not only does it promote the importance of knowing the signs for yourself, but can also contribute to a bystander knowing what to do and how to help."

NEW LEGISLATION SUPPORTS ATTRACTING SKILLED WORKERS TO SASKATCHEWAN

Labour Mobility and Fair Registration Practices Act

April 6, the Government of Saskatchewan has introduced *The Labour Mobility and Fair Registration Practices Act.* The Act will make Saskatchewan the best place in Canada to re-locate to from within the country or abroad for skilled workers. The Act will reduce barriers to working in the province to ensure skilled workers can have their skills and credentials recognized, while assisting employers in filling jobs across a number of key sectors, such as healthcare, construction and IT.

"To meet the demands of Saskatchewan's growing economy, it is important that we develop our current labour force as well as recruit domestically and internationally to bring more skilled workers to the province," Immigration and Career Training Minister Jeremy Harrison said. "This new legislation will be the most comprehensive of its kind and make Saskatchewan a destination of choice for skilled professionals and tradespeople."

SGI PROVIDING \$56 MILLION TO VOLUNTEER FIREFIGHTER DEPARTMENTS IN SASKATCHEWAN FOR TRAINING, EQUIPMENT



SGI is investing \$5.6 million to train and equip volunteer firefighters who respond to vehicle collisions on Saskatchewan roads.

The money will be used for a program that will be the first of its kind in Canada. The program's objectives are:

- To fund the delivery of training courses that allow volunteer firefighters to meet minimum standards for auto extrication; and
- Purchasing tools and equipment that support that training.

"Advancements in vehicle technology have led to new materials and designs in modern automobiles," Minister Responsible for SGI Don Morgan said. "Volunteer firefighters are often the first to respond to collisions on highways and rural roads, and it is essential that volunteer fire departments are kept up-to-date with evolving tool developments and adaptations around new car designs."

TAKE PRECAUTIONS AGAINST HANTAVIRUS DURING SPRING CLEANUP




Saskatchewan residents are being reminded to take precautions against hantavirus as they start spring cleanup of enclosed buildings or vehicles.

Hantavirus infection is caused by breathing in contaminated airborne particles from the droppings, urine and saliva of infected deer mice. It can cause a rare, but potentially fatal lung disease known as hantavirus pulmonary syndrome.

"Exposure most often occurs when cleaning up sheds, barns, garages, cabins, or vehicles after winter," Saskatchewan's Deputy Chief Medical Health Officer Dr. Julie Kryzanowski said. "Particles can become airborne after sweeping, but it's also possible to get the virus by touching something that has been contaminated, and then touching your nose, mouth or eyes."


