

SASKATCHEWAN CONTINUES TO HELP DISPLACED

UKRAINIANS FLEEING THE WAR



On Friday, August 12, 2022, Premier of Saskatchewan Honourable Scott Moe joined representatives from Solidaire and Open Arms, two international humanitarian organizations, to sign a memorandum of understanding (MOU). The MOU is a pledge by the three parties to partner on a total of five humanitarian flights aiming to bring more than 1,000 Ukraine citizens from Warsaw, Poland to Saskatchewan by March 31, 2023. The five flights include the two flights that departed Poland for Saskatchewan on July 4 and August 10, 2022.

"In true Saskatchewan fashion, Ukrainians have been met with kindness, support and compassion upon landing in our province," Premier of Saskatchewan Honourable Scott Moe said during a news conference. "Today, with the signing of this MOU, we commit to welcoming even more Ukrainian citizens. This is an important and meaningful step toward providing a safe refuge for people dealing with unimaginable situations."

"We are proud to partner with the Government of Saskatchewan on this important initiative," Open Arms' Air Corridor Coordinator, Francisco Gentico said. "The support in place for Ukrainians when they arrive in

Saskatchewan has far exceeded our expectations, and we know that the community will continue to help Ukrainians settle here as quickly and easily as possible."


SASKATCHEWAN LEADS PROVINCES IN BUILDING CONSTRUCTION INVESTMENT



August 12, Statistics Canada released June 2022 Investment in Building Construction numbers, which showed Saskatchewan with a 63.0 per cent increase (seasonally adjusted) compared to June 2021, ranking first among the provinces in terms of percentage change.

Saskatchewan also had strong month-to-month growth for building construction investment with a 17.6 per cent increase (seasonally adjusted) between May 2022 and June 2022, second among the provinces. The value of building construction investment in June 2022 was \$464 million, the highest monthly investment in the province since August 2013.

Investment in residential building construction also saw strong month-to-month growth with an increase of 24.0 per cent.



"Saskatchewan's economy is moving full steam ahead as we advance our Government's strategy to increase our exports and attract investment into the province," Trade and Export Development Minister Jeremy Harrison said. "Saskatchewan is a global leader in the sustainable production of the food, fuel and fertilizer that the world needs, a reality that will lead to more jobs and opportunities in our province for years to come."

SAKATCHEWAN LOWERS CHILD CARE FEES BY 70%



The governments of Saskatchewan and Canada have taken another important step to improve affordability and further reduce regulated child care fees for families with children under six. Starting September 1, 2022, parent fees for regulated child care will be reduced by an average of 70 per cent compared to March 2021 levels.



This fee reduction, the second announced this year, is part of close to \$1.1 billion being invested to transform child care in Saskatchewan through the 2021-22 to 2025-26 Canada-Saskatchewan Canada-Wide Early Learning and Child Care Agreement by making regulated child care more affordable for Saskatchewan families. Parent fee reductions represent spending of \$13.4 million over the last fiscal year and a total of \$74 million for 2022-23.


"With this latest fee reduction, we are one step closer to our goal of \$10-a-day child care by 2025-26."

SASKATCHEWAN EXPANDS COVID-19 ELIGIBILITY TO 18+



Residents 18 and older are now eligible for their fourth dose of the COVID-19 vaccination.

Saskatchewan is expanding the eligibility for fourth doses (second booster) of COVID-19 vaccinations to all residents aged 18 and older who have received a third dose four months ago or longer effective Monday, August 15, 2022.

"COVID-19 is still circulating in Saskatchewan and in other jurisdictions, which is why our province is expanding access," Chief Medical Health Officer Dr. Saqib Shahab said. "All COVID-19 vaccines approved in Canada have been deemed safe and our preliminary data shows that a second booster provides additional protection."

Immunity is shown to wane over time and the provision of booster doses is demonstrated to provide increased protection against serious illness, hospitalization and death.

COVID-19 vaccination appointments are available through the Saskatchewan Health Authority (SHA), Indigenous Services Canada, the Northern Inter-tribal Health Authority and at participating pharmacies throughout the province. Walk-in clinics are also available.



64.8% ANNUAL WHOLESALE TRADE GROWTH SEES SASKATCHEWAN LEADING CANADA



Saskatchewan continues to see strong results in key economic indicators with the value of wholesale trade jumping 64.8 per cent between June 2021 and June 2022, the highest increase among all provinces.

Saskatchewan also saw significant wholesale trade growth between May 2022 and June 2022 with an increase of 14.9 per cent, the second highest increase among all provinces. These numbers far exceed the national averages of month-to month and year-over-year wholesale trade growth, which were 0.1 per cent and 12.2 per cent, respectively. The total value of Saskatchewan wholesale trade reached \$4.2 billion in June 2022.



"Saskatchewan continues to be a national leader in economic growth with these extraordinarily strong wholesale trade numbers," Trade and Export Development Minister Jeremy Harrison said. "Our government's focus on boosting trade, increasing exports and strengthening Saskatchewan's international relationships is creating opportunities and jobs for the people of our province."

GOVERNMENT OF SASKATCHEWAN OFFERS FREE TRAINING FOR EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATORS



Saskatchewan is committing nearly \$9 million for training and professional development grants for the early learning and child care sector. This is part of Saskatchewan's commitment to improve quality in the early years and child care sector, and is just one of many programs delivered through the *Canada-Saskatchewan Canada-Wide Early Learning and Child Care Agreement*.

The province has partnered with Collège Mathieu, Saskatchewan Indian Institute of Technologies (SIIT) and Saskatchewan Polytechnic (Sask Polytech) to make Early Childhood Education (ECE) training opportunities available at no charge. The three post-secondary institutions have programming available beginning in 2022-23.

"Early Childhood Educators have a positive impact on the learning and development of Saskatchewan's youngest learners," Education Minister Dustin Duncan said. "That's why we are working with post-secondary institutions to deliver training opportunities for ECEs and those who want to work in early learning and child care."

"There is no child care system without an Early Learning and Child Care workforce," Canada's Minister of Families, Children and Social Development, Karina Gould, said. "Early Childhood Educators do incredible work in nurturing our children, and these training and professional development opportunities are meaningful to ensure they have access to the tools and resources they need to succeed."

Most Saskatchewan post-secondary institutions apply for the GRP on your behalf; however, you must provide consent to do so.




