

PREMIER MOE TRAVELS TO WASHINGTON AND MEXICO TO SUPPORT CANADA U.S. TRADE



Premier Scott Moe will travel to Washington D.C. this week for meetings with U.S. elected representatives, industry organizations and to participate in the premier's Council of the Federation (COF) joint-mission to Washington.

Prior to the COF mission, Premier Moe will meet with U.S. elected representatives and businesses to emphasize the strong trade relationship between Canada and the U.S, and the role Saskatchewan plays in supplying the continent with energy and food security.

"It's important in the current economic environment that we engage with our counterparts in the United States to emphasize the shared benefit of trade between our two countries and turn the conversation toward building on those strengths rather than jeopardizing them with tariffs," said Moe.

The U.S. is Saskatchewan's largest and most important trading partner. About \$40 billion worth of imports and exports cross the border every year. The current tariff-free border allows businesses to add value to products and economies, whether flowing from north to south or vice versa.



Premier Moe's meetings will focus on maintaining strong Canada-U.S. relations by addressing shared issues such as the economy, energy, supply chains and the impacts of the Trump Administration's proposed tariffs.

sides of the border. That's why it's so important to ensure continued free and fair trade.

We also discussed key issues like supply chains, market access, and expanding trade opportunities. Our collective goal is to ensure that Saskatchewan—and all of Canada—remain competitive on the global stage, fostering growth and prosperity for everyone."

THE GOVERNMENT OF SASKATCHEWAN IS INVESTING \$58 MILLION THIS YEAR TO ADDRESS GROWING STUDENT ENROLMENT



The Government of Saskatchewan is taking further action to support growing student enrolment by investing an additional \$29.5 million in relocatable classrooms. This mid-year funding increase brings the 2024-25 total investment in relocatables to \$58 million, providing 76 new relocatables to help alleviate space pressures in schools across the province.


"With Saskatchewan's growing population, we recognize the need for additional classroom space to support students and educators," Education Minister Everett Hindley said. "This additional investment will ensure schools that anticipate capacity challenges in 2025-26 have the necessary infrastructure to accommodate students."

The majority of the relocatables will be allocated to the fastest growing cities of Regina and Saskatoon. In addition, the communities of Clavet, Corman Park, Humboldt, Lloydminster, Martensville, Pilot Butte, Warman, and Weyburn will receive relocatables to alleviate space pressures.

School divisions will proceed with procurement and target installation prior to September 2025.



REPORT FROM THE LEGISLATURE



As we stepped into February, the path set for 2025 mirrors the old Canadian adage, "Cold hands - warm heart." Saskatchewan continues to be a steady economy and a province where decisions are made with the people in-mind first and foremost.

A strong economy is reflected in Saskatchewan's job market. Our province started off this year once again tied for the lowest unemployment rate among all provinces at 5.4 per cent in January. The province also added 9,900 new jobs year-over-year for the month. Year-end reporting announced this month highlighted major year-over-year job gains. Employment grew in construction, health care, social assistance and agriculture.

Investment continues to drive this momentum. Statistics Canada's latest GDP numbers indicate that Saskatchewan's 2023 real GDP reached an all-time high of \$77.9 billion, increasing by \$1.8 billion, or 2.3 per cent. This ties Saskatchewan for

second in the nation for real GDP growth, and above the national average of 1.6 per cent. Looking ahead, private capital investment is projected to reach \$14.2 billion for 2024, an increase of 14.4 per cent over 2023. This is the highest anticipated percentage increase in Canada.

Saskatchewan's resource sector remains a key contributor to this economic strength. The Government of Saskatchewan's Crown oil and natural gas public offering, held on Tuesday, February 4, 2025, raised \$3,039,589.20 for the province, with the Estevan area generating most of the revenue.


While economic growth in our province continues, our government is investing the benefits back into our communities. This month Saskatchewan committed to two initiatives - a total of \$31.7 million to community-based partners that facilitate interpersonal violence programs and \$29.5 million for 76 relocatable classrooms. Healthy environments for our children both at home and at school are paramount.

February is also a time to reflect on the province's rich culture as African-Canadian/Black History Month. An opportunity to honour, celebrate and recognize the legacy of African-Canadians across the province. Saskatchewan's motto: From Many Peoples Strength, emphasizes the importance of reflecting on the strong history and legacy of diverse communities in Saskatchewan.

A historic moment took place on January 31st with the installation of Her Honour the Honourable Bernadette McIntyre, S.O.M., Lieutenant Governor of Saskatchewan, as the 24th Lieutenant Governor of Saskatchewan during a ceremony at the Legislative Building. The Lieutenant Governor is the personal representative of the Sovereign in Saskatchewan and is responsible for granting Royal Assent to provincial laws, as well as summoning and dissolving the provincial legislature.

NEW RADIATION THERAPY PROGRAM BRINGS GOLD STANDARD OF CANCER CARE CLOSER TO HOME



Cervical cancer patients in Saskatchewan now have access to a new treatment option.

The Saskatchewan Cancer Agency (SCA) is proud to announce the launch of the Interstitial High-Dose-Rate (HDR) Gynecological Brachytherapy program. This safe, specialized, targeted form of radiation therapy is the gold standard of care. The program eliminates the need for patients with cervical cancer to travel out of province, with this treatment now available in Saskatchewan.

"Providing Saskatchewan cancer patients with world-class care and cutting-edge treatment options close to home remains a top priority for our government," Health Minister Jeremy Cockrill said. "We are dedicated to driving healthcare innovation that enhances patient outcomes and improves quality of life for all residents."

In January 2025, the program treated its first patient with this innovative treatment, which combines standard applicators with strategically placed interstitial needles. The technique provides a precise, high-dose radiation treatment that treats irregular-sized tumours while reducing radiation exposure to surrounding healthy tissues and minimizing side effects.

STATE OF THE CITY ADDRESS - REGINA





SASKATCHEWAN CONTINUES TAKING ACTION TO ADDRESS BREAST CANCER DIAGNOSTIC WAITLISTS



Out-of-Province Initiative Extended to Increase Patient Access to Urgent Diagnostics

The Government of Saskatchewan and the Saskatchewan Health Authority (SHA) are taking continued action to improve breast health services for Saskatchewan patients through a short-term extension to an initiative that allows patients to receive diagnostics at a medical facility in Calgary.

Established in November 2023, this agreement has been extended to March 2026 as a temporary measure to accelerate urgent diagnostic procedures until these services are fully stabilized in the province. The implementation of the Out-of-Province Program has significantly reduced wait times for urgent breast biopsies from November 2023 to date, bringing them in line with the clinically recommended target of three weeks or less.

"We are committed to ensuring Saskatchewan residents have access to safe, high quality, and timely breast health care services as we advance several measures to expand in-province capacity, implement new technologies and complete

construction on the new Breast Health Centre in Regina," Health Minister Jeremy Cockrill said. "We appreciate the dedication from our health care teams to accelerate urgent diagnostic breast cancer procedures and treatments following a diagnosis."

Eligible Saskatchewan patients who are waiting for urgent diagnostic breast procedures, such as breast biopsies, will be triaged by health care providers, who will contact them to ensure thorough screening and determine their interest in participating in the program.

SASKATCHEWAN'S YEAR STARTS OFF STRONG WITH THE LOWEST UNEMPLOYMENT RATE AMONG PROVINCES AND 9,000 NEW JOBS



According to the latest labour force survey numbers from Statistics Canada, Saskatchewan started off 2025 tied for the lowest unemployment rate among provinces at 5.4 per cent, below the national average of 6.6 per cent. The province also added 9,900 new jobs year-over-year for the month of January.

"Saskatchewan continues to regularly have one of the lowest unemployment rates in the nation as our economy continues to create more jobs and more opportunities," Deputy Premier and Immigration and Career Training Minister Jim Reiter said. "Our government is committed to ensuring that Saskatchewan continues to grow and that is why we are focused on growing access to health care and educational spaces while taking action to make life more affordable for Saskatchewan people."

Year-over-year full-time employment increased by 3,000, an increase of 0.6 per cent. Female employment is up 4,300, an increase of 1.5 per cent, and male employment is up 5,400, an increase of 1.7 per cent.

ADDRESSING GENDER-BASED VIOLENCE



We are investing \$3.8 million to 16 agencies over the next two years under the National Action Plan to End Gender-based Violence as part of its ongoing commitment to create safer communities. The National Action Plan is a cost-shared agreement between the federal and provincial government, based on pre-existing provincial interpersonal violence funding.

SASKATCHEWAN BUILDING PERMIT GROWTH CONTINUES TO SOAR



Province Ranks Second in Year-Over-Year Growth

Latest numbers by Statistics Canada show the value of the province's building permits increasing by 59.4 per cent from December 2023 to December 2024 (seasonally adjusted), placing Saskatchewan second year-over-year among the provinces.

These figures follow last month's report, which placed Saskatchewan second among the provinces for both year-over-year and month-over-month growth in the value of building permits.

"Saskatchewan's business-friendly environment is leading to more investment and economic activity, which is demonstrated through the continued growth of our construction sector," Minister of Trade and Export Development Warren Kaeding said. "The upward trend in building permits being issued is creating new jobs and opportunities for Saskatchewan people. Through our investment attraction efforts,

more people are choosing Saskatchewan to live, work, and raise a family than ever before."

Additionally, the Province's two largest cities both experienced strong year-over-year growth of 50.4 per cent in Regina and 34.2 per cent in Saskatoon respectively.

Free Fishing Weekend applies to all provincial waterbodies that allow sportfishing. All other regulations apply, including possession limits, and if you plan to take fish out of the province, you will need a valid Saskatchewan angling licence.



"In Saskatchewan, we are blessed to have some of the best sportfishing anywhere, right here in our backyard," Environment Minister Travis Keisig said. "Free Fishing Weekend is a great opportunity to discover - or rediscover - our beautiful province and the fun of angling with friends and family."

To make the most of your angling experience, keep these important things in mind:

Always, safety first! Be aware of ice thickness before travelling on it. Check out the <u>Winter Ice Safety Fact Sheet</u> for tips and ice thickness guidelines.

- Some waterbodies have lake-specific rules and regulations so check the Anglers Guide.
- Clean, drain and dry all your gear to reduce the risk of spreading aquatic invasive species.
- Don't litter! Remove all garbage from the ice and dispose of it properly.




