SASKATCHEWAN RESPONDS TO U.S. TARIFFS / FOLLOWED BY AN UPDATE FROM PREMIER MOE TODAY



The decision by President Trump to impose tariffs on all Canadian products is disappointing and will damage both our countries' economies, workers and consumers.

We agree that we need to have strong secure borders.

The US has been clear in this priority.

Saskatchewan has been equally clear about efforts to stop the flow of fentanyl and illegal migrants.

We have enhanced our provincial border security measures.

Saskatchewan is calling on the federal government to take all necessary steps to strengthen border security and have fentanyl removed from our communities in Canada and the USA.

I am calling on the federal government to strengthen the Criminal Code of Canada to toughen penalties for drug offences, specifically fentanyl.

As I have said, I support very targeted and specific retaliatory measures to initial tariffs. However, this should never be the longer-term answer.

Saskatchewan's exports are crucial to supporting food and energy security across North America and around the world. We will also be working to ensure diversification of Saskatchewan markets for our goods.

We will continue to work with all Saskatchewan businesses and other governments to find common ground on this important issue to ensure that damaging tariffs are removed as quickly as possible.

Make absolutely no mistake, these tariffs will cost American and Canadian families more.

That will weaken the highly integrated North American economy which benefits our nations that may not be our allies.

Tariffs are harmful to all of us in North America.

UPDATE FEBRUARY 3

The delay of President Trump's Tariffs is welcome news today.

However, we know there is more work to do.

This is a temporary pause, and we need to continue leveraging our relationships as we work to find a more permanent solution.

I would encourage the federal government to move quickly on their border security commitments to demonstrate real action in this 30-day window.

I will be reiterating the message that Saskatchewan's exports are crucial to North American food and energy security in Washington next week.

Under the Canadian Constitution, Lieutenant Governors are appointed by the Governor General on the advice of the Prime Minister for a minimum of five years; however, there is no fixed term of office.

A \$15 million gift from Nutrien is expected to be "transformational" for the University of Saskatchewan.

The university said the donation, which was announced on Monday, "will drive a new era of innovation, collaboration and success."

A large portion of the donation will be used to establish the Nutrien Centre for Sustainable and Digital Agriculture, which the university said will focus on research, training and technological innovation to help bring farming into the digital age while creating sustainable and resilient food systems around the globe.

The donation will also establish the Nutrien Future Fund at the university's College of Agriculture and Bioresources, providing scholarships and community engagement initiatives. The donation will also support scholarships and the creation of a new lecture theatre at the College of Engineering.

"We are deeply grateful for this incredible donation which builds on our longstanding relationship with Nutrien over the past five decades," Peter Stoicheff, the university's president, said in a statement.

Stoicheff noted that Nutrien is the university's single largest corporate donor, having provided more than \$50 million over the years. In March of 2024, the company also announced a \$15 million donation to help Saskatchewan Polytech establish its new campus at the university.

REPORT FROM THE LEGISLATURE



As we wrapped up a very busy first month of 2025, our government is making great strides in their commitment to making Saskatchewan more affordable, even safer and the best province in Canada to live and work. There are several initiatives already underway to ensure we meet these promises and more.

A strong economy continues to be the foundation of our success. This month Statistics Canada released data indicating two key strengths of our province; value of building permits and our strong labour market. We ranked as the second highest province with a 26.2 per cent year-over-year increase for the value of building permits in 2024. Additionally, there were 14,000 jobs created in our province last year making us the third lowest unemployment rate in Canada with 606,200 people employed – an all-time record high.

Recently the Provincial Traffic Safety Fund awarded almost \$1.6 million to support vital traffic safety improvement projects in 79 communities all around Saskatchewan. The Provincial Traffic Safety Fund Grant committee is currently accepting applications for the next round of funding. The deadline for applications is March 31, 2025. Interested applicants are encouraged to visit SGI's website for more information: http://www.sgi.sk.ca/community-grants-programs.

To enhance border integrity between Saskatchewan and the United States, the Government of Saskatchewan has introduced a Saskatchewan Border Security Plan (SBSP). The SBSP enables the Ministry of Corrections, Policing and Public Safety to mobilize Provincial Protective Services officers to work in partnership with

provincial policing services and federal agencies to boost law enforcement's presence near the border.

Families around the province now have another option to get tested and treated for strep throat and ear infections. The Government of Saskatchewan has launched new services in eleven pharmacies in multiple communities, allowing pharmacists to provide one-stop testing for strep throat and ear infections. They will also be able to prescribe and dispense medication to treat those conditions as needed. For more information, see the attachment at the bottom of this webpage.

Canada's Minister of Agriculture Agri-Food Lawrence MacAulay and Saskatchewan's Minister of Agriculture Daryl Harrison announced \$6.9 million to jointly support livestock and forage-related scientific research in Saskatchewan in 2025. These funds combined with co-funding from industry partners have reached a total of \$7.2 million. The investment is part of Saskatchewan's 2024-25 Budget of \$37 million for agriculture research.

achievements over the years.



MAJOR INVESTMENTS MADE TO END GENDER BASED VIOLENCE



Saskatchewan is investing a total of \$3.8 million to 16 agencies over the next two years under the National Action Plan to End Gender-based Violence.

The investment will provide for enhanced programs, supports and tools in Saskatchewan communities. The funding includes money to build capacity in transition homes and second stage housing facilities, providing learning resources on healthy relationships to Saskatchewan residents, support enhanced early intervention for families at risk of violence, and develop additional tools to ensure appropriate responses to survivors and perpetrators of interpersonal violence.

"The funding and programming we are announcing today are a critical part of our ongoing work under the National Action Plan to End Gender-based Violence, and align strongly with the recommendations contained in the recently released Domestic Violence Death Review," Justice Minister and Attorney General Tim McLeod said. "I am grateful to all our partner organizations for collaborating with us

on this, and the work they do across Saskatchewan to address and prevent gender-based violence."

"Saskatchewan's implementation of the National Action Plan to End Gender-based Violence is focused on prevention, awareness, and building supports for survivors and their loved ones," Minister Responsible for the Status of Women Alana Ross said. "Our government remains committed to preventing interpersonal violence and abuse in all forms."



Saskatchewan has proclaimed February as African-Canadian/Black History Month to honour, celebrate and recognize the legacy of African-Canadians across the province.



MILLIONS OF FENTANYL DOES SEIZED IN SASKATCHEWAN TRAFFIC STOP



Saskatchewan continues to see significant results from the strong partnerships that exist between the RCMP and the Ministry of Corrections, Policing and Public Safety's Provincial Protective Services (PPS). Together, the RCMP's specialized policing teams and the PPS's Conservation Officer Service and Saskatchewan Highway Patrol (SHP) officers are targeting illicit drugs, weapons and human trafficking cases near the border and across the province.

During a proactive patrol on January 28, 2025, the RCMP and Saskatchewan Highway Patrol officers conducted a traffic stop in the Swift Current area. During a vehicle search, officers located eight kilograms of fentanyl hidden under a spare tire. As a result of the investigation, two occupants in the vehicle were charged with trafficking and possession for the purpose of trafficking.

"Thank you to the Saskatchewan RCMP, Saskatchewan Highway Patrol, conservation officers and all of our policing partners for their service to the people of Saskatchewan," Premier Scott Moe said. "This seizure of fentanyl is another significant outcome we are seeing from our investments in the Saskatchewan RCMP and the Provincial Protective Services as they tackle crime and prevent harmful drugs from reaching our communities."






