### CITY REVEALS VISUALS, DESIGN CONCEPTS OF DOWNTOWN EVENT AND ENTERTAINMENT DISTRICT



City reveals visuals, design concepts of Downtown Event and Entertainment District

The Governance and Priorities Committee of City Council will have the opportunity at its February

14th meeting to discuss the visionary opportunities of the Downtown Event and Entertainment

District (District).

Included in a group of reports is a first look at the artistic renderings of what the area around the event centre/arena and convention centre could look like and the first look at the strategic directions for the District Plan outlining the template for a rejuvenated Downtown.

"These renderings really help illustrate that the District is much more than just an event centre and convention centre – it is to be a community gathering place in any season," says Dan Willems, Director of Technical Services, Transportation & Construction Division. "They show the potential of the public spaces, with places for events, amenities and open areas where visitors and people from all parts of the city can meet and share unique experiences."



The visuals show what the proposed event centre/arena and convention centre could look like, with a focus along a transformed 22nd Street. Both winter and summer scenes are captured, showing the potential for winter festivals, outdoor markets and summer activities.

"This is an opportunity for people in Saskatoon to really see how the vision for the District could become reality," Willems says. "Up until now we have been talking about the District in very abstract terms, but these images help put context and meaning to the idea of an active space that is open to all. These are by no means the final designs of the area, but they are a great to help visualize the conceptual design and potential in creating a vital and dynamic Downtown, with economic impacts that will have a positive effect on Saskatoon and Saskatchewan."

The District Plan, which is being developed simultaneously along with the plans for the event centre/arena and convention centre, takes a wider view of Downtown Saskatoon and looks at how the land can be best used to achieve a vibrant mix of residential, business, social and outdoor activity, while making the Downtown more accessible for everyone to get to and get around in. The District Plan will also work to create a cohesive strategy for the Downtown as a whole, ensuring that the entire area develops in a sustainable and productive way.

Additionally in this group of reports to GPC is a Decision Report on acquiring the YMCA building and its associated land. This acquisition, while currently part of the larger District project, is part of the larger strategy to have a contiguous area of land with significant redevelopment potential to accommodate future expansion of the convention centre and a new parking structure in the area of ldylwyld and 22nd Street.

#### FOUR VETERAN MLAS NOT SEEKING RE-ELECTIONS

#### Four Veteran MLAs Not Seeking Re-election

Four long-time Saskatchewan Party MLAs today announced they will not be seeking re-election in the 2024 provincial election.

Humboldt MLA Donna Harpauer, Indian Head-Milestone MLA Don McMorris, Weyburn-Big Muddy MLA Dustin Duncan and Saskatoon Northwest MLA Gord Wyant will not be running again in 2024.

Harpauer and McMorris were first elected in 1999 and have been re-elected five times since then. Duncan was first elected in 2006 and has been re-elected four times. Wyant was first elected in 2010 and has been re-elected three times. All four have served for many years in cabinet in various significant portfolios.


"That's over 80 years of combined political experience and service to the people of Saskatchewan and that's not easy to replace," said Premier Scott Moe. "But at the same time, every government and every party needs renewal, and I respect the decision that Donna, Don, Dustin and Gord all made - that it's time for renewal in their constituencies and for a new chapter in each of their lives.



### MAKING LIFE MORE AFFORDABLE WITH THE ACTIVE FAMILIES BENEFIT



With tax season around the corner, the Government of Saskatchewan is reminding families with children and youth participating in sports, culture, and recreation that they can access the Active Families Benefit when they file their 2023 taxes.

The benefit is available to families with an annual income up to \$60,000. They can receive up to \$150 per year, for each child 18 years or younger, or \$200 per year for children who are eligible for the federal Child Disability Tax Credit. Eligible families claim the benefit when they file their taxes.



"The Active Families Benefit is a tax credit that helps make activities more affordable and accessible for Saskatchewan families," Parks, Culture and Sport Minister Laura Ross said. "For parents who enrolled their children in sport, culture and recreation activities in 2023, they should hang onto their receipts, in order to claim the benefit when they do their taxes later this spring."

### ICE ROADS PROVIDE A VITAL LINK TO NORTHERN COMMUNITIES



The Wollaston Lake and Stony Rapids to Fond du Lac ice roads have opened for the 2024 winter season.

Typically, ice roads open in mid-February and close at the end of March, weather permitting.

An unseasonably warm start to winter delayed the start of roadbuilding but crews have been assisted in recent weeks by colder weather.

"Ice roads connect the north to the rest of the province, so people can travel for work, school and medical appointments," Highways Minister Lori Carr said. "They also permit the transport of critical supplies like food and fuel. I'd like to thank the workers who build and maintain these routes for their friends and neighbours in northern communities."

**REMINDER - TIPS TO PREVENT FALLS** 





### RECORD AGRICULTURAL EXPORTS FOR FOURTH CONSECUTIVE YEAR



Saskatchewan's agriculture industry has posted a fourth consecutive year of record agri-food exports, with shipments totaling \$20.2 billion for 2023.

The leading agri-food export commodities in 2023 were non-durum wheat, canola seed, canola oil, durum, lentils and canola meal. The top five international market destinations were the United States, China, Japan, Mexico and Algeria.

"Strong export numbers demonstrate the world-class sustainability and reliability of our province's agriculture sector," Trade and Export Development Minister Jeremy Harrison said. "As we have already surpassed our 2030 Growth Plan target of \$20 billion in agri-food exports, this milestone not only reflects the dedication of Saskatchewan farmers, but also the global demand for the high-quality agricultural products that they consistently deliver."

A newly ratified contract between Saskatchewan physicians and the Government of

Saskatchewan marks a significant achievement in the latest Saskatchewan Health Human

Resources (HHR) Action Plan update.

Highlights of the new, four-year contract include:

- An overall average general rate increase of 2.5 per cent per year (April 1, 2022 to March 31, 2026).
- A competitive market rate adjustment applied to the first year of the agreement.

 Increased funding to support long term retention, parental leave and continuing medical education.

The agreement will help in the effort to retain and recruit physicians in Saskatchewan and works to provide patients in the province with enhanced access to primary health care.

The new contract also introduces funding to address gender pay inequity in physician fee codes, as well as funding to support physician training and awareness related to equity, diversity, racism, and truth and reconciliation.

"Continued investment into our physicians allows Saskatchewan to remain desirable for family doctors and specialists to live and work," Health Minister Everett Hindley said. "Our new agreement will ensure continued retention of our quality doctors as well as incentivize more professionals to choose Saskatchewan."

#### STUDY RESPIRATORY THERAPY




Are you or do you know someone looking for a hands-on health care training opportunity? Seats are reserved for #skstudent to study Respiratory Therapy at the SAIT!


### SASKATOON OFFERS OUTDOOR ADVENTURES AND INDOOR RETREATS


