
KRISTOS RODYVSYA - MERRY CHRISTMAS TO EVERYONE CELBRATING UKRAINIAN CHRISTMAS

The Saskatchewan Affordability Act and ongoing annual indexation are two ways the Government of Saskatchewan is taking action to ensure the province remains the most affordable place in Canada.

"Every year our government adjusts the provincial income tax brackets and basic tax credits to protect Saskatchewan citizens from the rising cost of inflation, which is also known as indexation," Deputy Premier and Finance Minister Jim Reiter said. "This provides safeguards against the inflationary pressures that would otherwise push taxpayers into higher tax brackets and reduce the actual value of tax credits. Given the current affordability concerns, it is important we take these steps to help make life more affordable for the people of Saskatchewan."

The level of indexation in 2025 will be 2.7 per cent, which matches the annual average national inflation rate from October 2023 to September 2024. In 2025, Saskatchewan residents will see \$40.5 million in annual tax savings from indexation.

"A family of four will not pay any Saskatchewan income tax on the first \$63,200 of their income, the highest tax-free threshold for a family of four in Canada," Reiter said. "We have more than doubled this tax-free amount during our time in government, which continues to provide significant savings for people throughout the province and helps make life more affordable."

Indexation was also incorporated into *The Saskatchewan Affordability Act*, which was recently passed in the Legislative Assembly. The Act reduced personal income tax in Saskatchewan by increasing rates for the basic personal, spousal and child exemptions, as well as the seniors supplement, by \$500 a year for the next four years on top of annual indexation adjustments.

The Act provides significant benefits to pensioners and others who are on fixed incomes by indexing and increasing the rate of the Saskatchewan Low-Income Tax Credit, while persons with disabilities, as well as their caregivers, will also benefit from increased tax credits.

The commitments in *The Saskatchewan Affordability Act* are in addition to the more than \$2 billion in affordability measures already included in each and every provincial budget.

You've got your angling licence and ice shacks ready. It's the long-awaited ice fishing season, and you're eager to get out there!  $\mathbb{Z}$  But before you step foot on the ice, take a moment to check the ice thickness and ensure it's safe for you to do so.

### Avoid ice that:

- looks slushy;
- has thawed, then froze again;
- is near open water;
- is layered, caused by sudden temperature changes; or
- has structures on it, such as pressure ridges.

Take care out there, anglers, and happy ice fishing season!







### Rink Rules:

    - Spend a few minutes scraping the ice.
- Shovel snow OVER the boards. When shoveled snow is left against the boards, it turns ice solid and the volunteer crew is getting too old to shovel hard now.
- Always leave the place cleaner than you found it. Don't leave garbage and if you see some, please pick it up. There are garbage cans outside and inside the warm-up rink.
- Children and inexperienced skaters should use an approved helmet while on the ice to prevent injuries.
  - Do not use the rink during unusually warm weather.
  - Stay off the ice surface while it's being resurfaced.

PROCUREMENT BEGINS FOR SASKATCHEWAN POLYTECHNIC JOSEPH A. REMAI SASKATOON CAMPUS



The Ministry of SaskBuilds and Procurement and Saskatchewan Polytechnic have issued a Request for Qualifications (RFQ) to procure a new Skilled Trades and Technology (trades) building.

The new trades building is using a Design-Build procurement model for its delivery as the first building planned as part of the new Joseph A. Remai Saskatoon campus.

"This is an important next step in building the new Saskatoon campus," SaskBuilds and Procurement Minister David Marit said. "We are pleased to work with our partners to make this happen. The Request for Qualifications shows our focus is on creating a top facility for students and industry. Starting this process will help us find the right team to build the new Skilled Trades and Technology building for Saskatchewan Polytechnic."

The new trades building is the first building planned as part of a new and consolidated campus in Saskatoon. It will be built on a green field site, located at Innovation Place Saskatoon, adjacent to the University of Saskatchewan.

"Saskatchewan's post-secondary institutions are crucial in positioning the province as a global research leader, further solidifying our reputation as a hub for innovation," Minister Responsible for Innovation Saskatchewan Warren Kaeding

said. "This new campus will open more opportunities for Saskatchewan students and aim to attract top talent to cultivate our future innovation leaders."

Training for new recruits includes (but is not limited to): communication, de-escalation, use of force techniques, comprehensive legal studies, cultural and diversity awareness and officer wellness and mental health.

The program is designed to help recruits develop the knowledge, skills and abilities required to excel as police officers.

"Congratulations to the new recruits starting their career at the Saskatchewan Police College, which celebrated its 50th anniversary in 2024," Corrections, Policing and Public Safety Minister Tim McLeod said. "The College has shaped generations of police officers and prepared more than 2,100 officers for frontline policing positions since 1974. We thank the Police College staff, management and recruits for their commitments each year to the safety and security of our province."


