



10 of Saskatchewan's best will be invested with the province's highest honour, the Saskatchewan

Order of Merit. Lieutenant Governor Russ Mirasty will invest the 2024 recipients at a formal ceremony in Regina.

"Each one of this year's honourees earned this prestigious award through years of effort dedicated to the betterment of their communities and our province," Mirasty said. "I am sincerely grateful for their commitment and contributions. It is my privilege to recognize these remarkable recipients and offer them my wholehearted congratulations."





Saskatchewan is a global leader in agricultural production and research. The innovation and ingenuity of Saskatchewan's farmers, ranchers and agri-businesses was on full display at Canada's Farm Show in Regina June 18-20. The show welcomed over 20,000 visitors from 50 different countries while generating millions in economic activity for the province.

Our province is committed to driving research and innovation in our agriculture sector. Over the last five years, our government has invested almost \$52 million into crop-related research through the Agriculture Development Fund alone. That support helps our producers stay competitive and profitable in international markets, having a tremendous impact in Saskatchewan and around the world.

Those investments are paying off, with four consecutive years of record agri-food exports. In 2023, our exports totaled \$20.2 billion, reaching our agri-food exports target of \$20 billion for 2030 six years ahead of schedule.

In 2023, Saskatchewan exported over \$7 billion to the Indo-Pacific Region. The top exporting destination in the region was China with \$4.3 billion worth of agri-food products followed by Japan, India, Indonesia and Bangladesh.

Agri-food exports to Vietnam were up 227 per cent in 2023 as well. The increase was led by non-durum wheat, which was Saskatchewan's largest agri-food export in 2023, rising nearly 32 per cent to a total of \$3.7 billion in world-wide exports. Other top agri-food exports to Vietnam included peas and pure-bred swine.

This year has started off strong as well. In the first quarter of 2024, agricultural exports to India increased 1,217 per cent, totaling over 460,000 metric tonnes. As Saskatchewan's top pulse market, exports to India were made up of peas and lentils.

Our province has several more ambitious goals for the agriculture sector, such as increasing crop production to 45 million metric tonnes annually and livestock cash receipts to \$3 billion per year. The future of sustainable innovation in agriculture isn't something we're waiting for to arrive someday - it's happening right now in Saskatchewan.

Thank you to all the farmers, ranchers and agri-businesses in our province who are dedicated to producing the food the world needs. We wish you all the best for a great season in 2024. 

SASKATCHEWAN'S POPULATION HITS ANOTHER ALL-TIME HIGH



There are more people than ever living and working in Saskatchewan! According to the latest estimates from Statistics Canada, Saskatchewan's population is steadily growing. As of April 1, 2024, the population reached 1,231,043 and is on its way to fulfilling Saskatchewan's Growth Plan Goal of 1.4 million people by 2030.

Saskatchewan's population has topped 1,230,000 for the first time according to the latest quarterly population estimates released today by Statistics Canada.

There were 1,231,043 people living in Saskatchewan as of April 1, 2024 - an increase of 5,550 people over the past quarter and 30,503 people over the past year.

Premier Scott Moe said a growing province is a sign of a strong economy that's creating more jobs and opportunities.

"A growing population and a strong economy means a bright future for our province and our people," Moe said.

- Organize an invasive species removal event to improve wildlife habitat. To maintain the competitive spirit, award prizes to teams who pull the most invasive weeds.

Statistics Canada released retail trade figures for April 2024, positioning Saskatchewan first in the nation for month-over-month growth. Retail sales in the province surged by 8.5 per cent, totaling \$2.2 billion in April 2024 (seasonally-adjusted), compared to March 2024.

EMS BUDGET ENHANCEMENTS BENEFIT EMS SERVICES ACROSS SASKATCHEWAN



The 2024-25 Provincial Budget investment for emergency medical services (EMS) is stabilizing and enhancing services in communities across the province, including rural and northern communities.

Government provided an increase of over \$7.5 million in annual funding to deliver ongoing support for additional EMS and community paramedicine positions added in Saskatoon last year and to provide competitive wages for paramedics working for contracted EMS services.


It has also boosted funding and resources for EMS and community paramedicine in rural and northern Saskatchewan communities resulting in more stable ambulance services.

CROP REPORT FOR THE PERIOD JUNE 11 TO JUNE 17, 2024



Seeding is virtually complete, with only one per cent of acres unseeded in Saskatchewan.

Unseeded acres are due to the frequent rainfall and excess moisture conditions in many regions.

Cooler temperatures and excess moisture conditions are causing delays to overall crop development. Fall cereals, spring wheat and oilseeds are behind normal development as compared to previous weeks. Warmer temperatures would be appreciated by producers to support crop advancement.

Rain fell throughout much of the province again this week with some areas receiving significant amounts. The highest rainfall recorded fell in the Rosthern area at 95 mm. The Nipawin area reported 75 mm followed by the Biggar area at 72 mm. Although the rain is supporting crop growth in some regions of the province, it is causing crop stress and disease in others that received excess moisture.

SASKATCHEWAN MARSHALS SERVICE UPDATE AND APPOINTMENT OF NEW DEPUTY CHIEF MARSHAL



The Saskatchewan Marshals Service (SMS) is making significant progress toward becoming operational by the end of 2026. The 2024-25 Provincial Budget has allocated \$7 million toward the development of the SMS, with an annual budget of \$20 million once it's operational. The SMS aims to enhance policing in the province with a particular focus on rural communities while supporting and assisting the RCMP, First Nations, and municipal police services across the province. The Service will address gangs, rural crime, illegal weapons and drugs, and will work to apprehend high-risk individuals and offenders with outstanding warrants.

"The Saskatchewan Marshals Service will stand as an innovative, responsive and communityengaged approach to the complex modern challenges facing policing services in the province,"

The Government of Saskatchewan reminded farmers and ranchers about some key dates as the annual highways hay salvage and ditch mowing clips along for the season.


Landowners or lessees adjacent to a highway ditch have the first option to cut or bale free hay prior to and including July 8.

After July 8 anyone may cut or bale material without the permission of the nearby landowner or lessee, as long as the same activity or mowing is not underway.
