NEW LEGISLATURE TO MEET STARTING NOVEMBER 25th WITH THE SPEECH FROM THE THRONE



The Lieutenant Governor of Saskatchewan
His Honour the Honourable Russ Mirasty
will formally open the First Session of the
Thirtieth Legislative Assembly of Saskatchewan
in the Assembly Chamber at two o'clock p.m.
on Monday, November 25, 2024

Premier Scott Moe announced that the first session of the new Legislative Assembly will begin on Monday, November 25 - exactly four weeks following the provincial general election.

"Saskatchewan people elected a government with a mandate for a strong economy and a bright future, but we also know that many people voted for change and we will deliver both," Moe said. "The new Legislature provides an opportunity for a new beginning, and we won't waste any time getting to work on the priorities of residents."

The fall sitting is expected to last two weeks, which will allow for debate and passage of the Throne Speech and introduction of several pieces of legislation,

including bills required to fulfill the government's campaign commitments.

"We are incredibly grateful for the opportunity to govern for all residents regardless of who they voted for," Moe said. "Saskatchewan people can expect to see some very specific goals that will drive some much-needed improvements in the areas of health care and education, while also implementing the affordability measures and the economic growth initiatives we have committed to."

The session will begin with the election of the Speaker in the morning followed by the Lieutenant Governor delivering the Throne Speech in the afternoon.

"Holodomor, The Great Famine, is still present in the hearts and minds of the Ukrainian community over 90 years later," Honorary Consul of Ukraine Ken Krawetz said. "We join our Saskatchewan citizens of Ukrainian heritage and those across the globe, to remember this dark time and honour those lost."

around the world marking the Holodomor genocide.

TOUR OF THE SASKATCHEWAN CYCLOTRON FACILITY



I had the pleasure of visiting the Saskatchewan Cyclotron Facility, which is owned by the University of Saskatchewan and operated by the Sylvia Fedoruk Canadian Centre for Nuclear Innovation, Inc. (the Fedoruk Centre).



The Facility is a unique-in-Canada resource for Saskatchewan scientists to develop new nuclear imaging and therapeutic methods to diagnose and treat afflictions such as cancer, infections, or Alzheimer's disease. We also produce a nuclear-imaging agent (FDG) that enables over 3000 Saskatchewan cancer patients each year to receive PET-CT scans as a first step in treatment planning – a game-changer for healthcare. We would be delighted to introduce you to our Facility and team, as well as the other work of the Fedoruk Centre, helping to place Saskatchewan among global leaders of nuclear research, development and training.

PROVINCE EXPANDS CYSTIC FIBROSIS DRUG COVERAGE



More patients in Saskatchewan living with cystic fibrosis (CF) are now eligible for Trikafta, a medication that improves lung function.

Effective November 15, coverage of Trikafta has expanded to include CF patients who have one of 152 rare genetic mutations which have proven to be responsive to the medication. The expansion will cover most Saskatchewan patients with CF.

"We are pleased to expand coverage for this treatment for more Saskatchewan people with cystic fibrosis," Health Minister Jeremy Cockrill said. "We know that

Trikafta improves the quality of life for patients, so expanding coverage to include these rare genetic mutations means more CF patients and their families will benefit for years to come."

WITH WINTER UPON US, PLEASE HAVE AN EMERGENCY KIT IN YOUR VEHICLE



Please remember to be aware of the following tips if you are stuck in the snow:

- Try to stay calm and don't go out in the cold. Stay in your car: you will avoid getting lost and your car is a safe shelter.
- Don't tire yourself out. Shoveling in the intense cold can be deadly.
- Let in fresh air by opening a window on the side sheltered from the wind.
- Keep the engine off as much as possible. Be aware of carbon monoxide poisoning and make sure the exhaust pipe is not obstructed by snow.
- If possible, use a candle place inside a deep can instead of the car heater to warm up.
- Turn on warning lights or set up road flares to make your car visible.
- Turn on the ceiling light; leaving your headlights or hazard lights on for too long will drain the battery.
- Move your hands, feet and arms to maintain circulation. Stay awake.
- Keep an eye out for other cars and emergency responders. Try to keep clothing dry since wet clothing can lead to a dangerous loss of body heat.
