FIRST ROBOT-ASSISTED SURGERIES BENEFIT SASKATCHEWAN RESIDENTS



Saskatchewan patients are benefitting from a new state-of-the-art robotic-assisted surgical system that contributes to less pain and faster recovery times.

Since September, more than two dozen surgeries have been performed using the da Vinci Surgical System, which is the first program of its kind in the province.

"We are pleased that Saskatchewan patients and physicians can benefit from this innovative treatment option close to home," Health Minister Paul Merriman said. "Having a robotic surgical program advances patient care and helps to develop and attract highly-skilled physicians to our health system."

Sincere thanks to Saskatoon Willowgrove resident Merlis Belsher family, and to all the donors, for their contributions to St. Paul's Hospital Foundation - Saskatoon. Their generosity has enabled the purchase of the da Vinci surgical system, Saskatchewan's first state-of-the-art surgical robot. The Merlis Belsher family alone gave \$1.1 million. The robot has been affectionately named Daryl, in honour of the Belsher's late son. The total purchase cost is \$2.5 million, \$1.5 million provided by the foundation and a further \$1 million from the Government of Saskatchewan.

YOUR LEGISLATIVE REPORT



A growing economy in Saskatchewan has allowed our government to expand investments in the programs and services that make a difference. These initiatives benefit our most vulnerable residents while supporting the needs of a growing population.

A strong province is one where everyone benefits from growth. This fall, your Saskatchewan Party

Government introduced new legislation that will create a more inclusive and accessible province for all people. *The Accessible Saskatchewan Act* will establish standards and regulations that will lead the way to support people with disabilities. Following the principle of "Nothing about us, without us", this new legislation will continue to engage the community in this important work.

We will lead by example with this new legislation. To ensure organizations are supported, the proposed legislation will apply to the government first, including rolling out an accessibility plan. The legislation includes an Accessibility Advisory Committee, with at least half of the members being persons with disabilities or from organizations representing people with disabilities. We will increase public awareness of issues impacting the community through the Saskatchewan Accessibility Office, which will monitor compliance concerns. The legislation will also recognize sign language as the primary form of communication for people who are deaf. By introducing these changes, we are working to create a province where persons with disabilities can fully participate.

Our government is embarking on a new one-year pilot project to deliver services to victims of human trafficking. Partnering with Hope Restored Canada, we are investing \$150,000 to expand secure housing, counselling, treatment and life skills programs. This initiative results from months of work with Hope Restored Canada to support victims as they heal from the trauma inflicted and pave a new path for their lives.

Supporting Saskatchewan's efforts to prevent interpersonal violence and abuse, our government endorses the new *National Action Plan to End Gender-Based Violence*. Unveiled in Nova Scotia at the 40th Annual Meeting of Ministers Responsible for the Status of Women, the action plan is a collaboration between governments, stakeholders and Indigenous organizations. Implementing the National Action Plan will build on the initiatives already in place, including the \$25 million in annual support Saskatchewan currently provides.

As Saskatchewan continues to grow, our government is working to provide more support to families. A \$28.9 million joint investment with the Government of Canada will see nearly 2,200 new regulated childcare spaces across the province. With this announcement, Saskatchewan will have just shy of 23,000 regulated childcare spaces, well on our way to creating 28,000 spaces by the end of March 2026 and reducing fees to \$10 a day. On average, 70 per cent of childcare fees have now been reduced in Saskatchewan thanks to the *Canada-Saskatchewan Canada-Wide Early Learning and Child Care Agreement*.

Seniors across the province will see more financial support in the coming months. This year, our government increased the maximum monthly benefit through the *Senior's Income Plan* by \$30 per month, with a second \$30 increase approved for 2023/24. Around \$34 million in annual funding helps support 14,500 low-income seniors in the province.

Increased investments are made possible by the strong economy. Our government will continue to make sure all residents see the benefits. New private investment, more jobs and higher resource revenues support expanding these important government services. That's growth that works for everyone.

SASKATCHEWAN'S FINANCES ON TRACK AT MID-YEAR

At mid-year, Saskatchewan is forecasting a surplus of \$1.1 billion for 2022-23, up from the first quarter forecast by \$50.1 million, and a \$1.6 billion improvement from budget.

"Our province's strong economy and resources that belong to all Saskatchewan people are contributing to the province's bottom line," Deputy Premier and Finance Minister Donna Harpauer said. "Revenue is forecast to be up from budget, largely the result of high potash and oil prices, as well as higher taxation revenue which reflects solid economic growth. Using higher-than-expected revenue to help people and businesses address higher costs due to inflation, while reducing the province's debt, is growth that works for everyone."

MORE SPACES ADDED TO THE EARLY LEARNING INTENSIVE SUPPORT ELIS PROGRAM IN SASKATCHEWAN SCHOOLS



The **Early Learning Intensive Support** program is increasing available spaces

The Governments of Saskatchewan and Canada are pleased to announce that more children who require intensive support to attend Prekindergarten will be supported thanks to the expansion of the province's Early Learning Intensive Support (ELIS) program. The ELIS program will now support an additional 150 preschool-aged children for the 2022-23 school year.

"Supporting our youngest learners is essential to their success in their future education paths," Education Minister Dustin Duncan said. "We are pleased to continue to support and increase the availability of the ELIS program to more preschool-aged children across the province."

The ELIS program is for three and four-year-old children with significant, enduring disabilities and developmental delays requiring intensive support to meet their potential. Almost 400 children will benefit from the ELIS program in 26 school divisions this year.

PROVINCE-RECOGNIZED NATIONAL ADDICTIONS AWARENESS WEEK

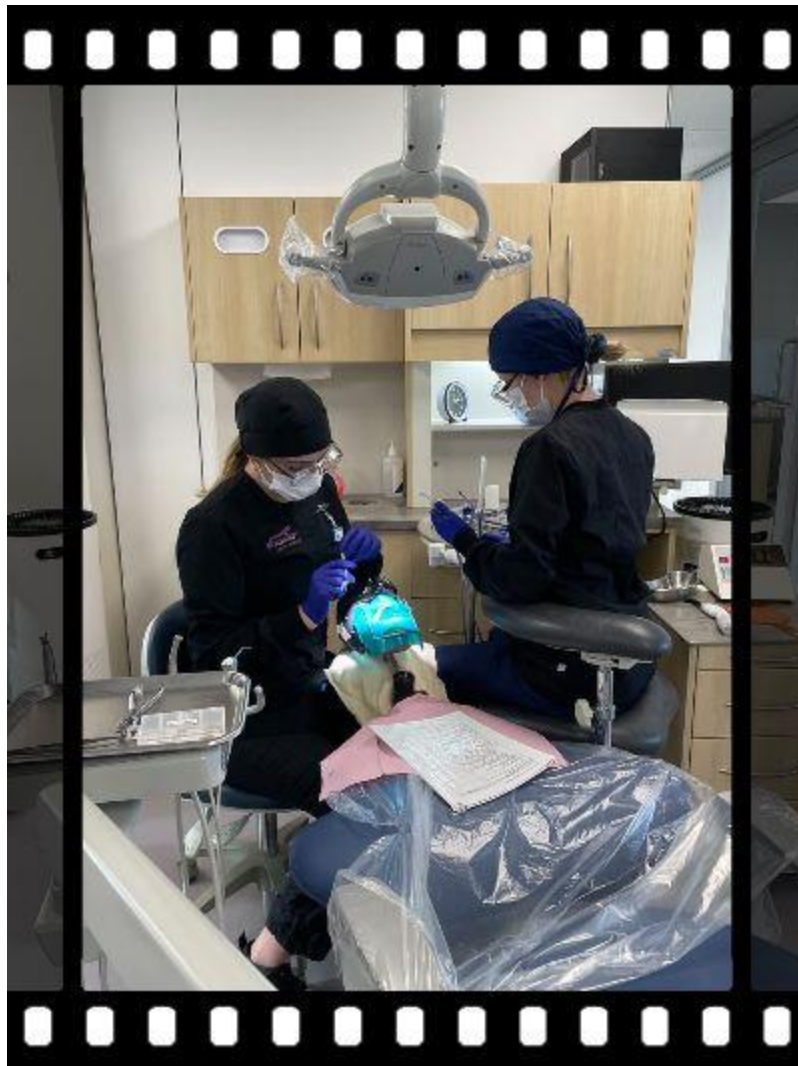


The Government of Saskatchewan is proclaiming November 20 to 26, 2022 as National Addictions Awareness Week.

FOURTH UKRAINE HUMANITARIAN FLIGHT LANDED IN SASKATOON



The fourth humanitarian flight from [#Poland](#) to [#Saskatchewan](#) landed in Saskatoon last week..

This is the first flight to land in Saskatoon. The 230 seats available for displaced Ukrainians filled in four days after registration opened.

Approximately 3,000 displaced Ukrainians have arrived in Saskatchewan since the war began. The Government of Saskatchewan continues to support and stand with Ukraine.

HOLODOMOR MEMORIAL DAY



During a special service at the Legislative Building today, MLA Terry Dennis, Legislative Secretary responsible for Saskatchewan-Ukraine Relations, joined with members of the province's Ukrainian community to commemorate the millions who died during the 1932-33 famine in Ukraine.

"The incomprehensible tragedy of the Holodomor, the Great Famine, took place 90 years ago, but it must not and will not be forgotten," Dennis said. "We remember and we join with our fellow citizens of Ukrainian heritage in Saskatchewan to ensure those who suffered and those who perished in those terrible years will be forever in our memory."

The service was held in solidarity with Holodomor Memorial Week, and a memorial candle was lit and will remain lit throughout the week to represent unity with those around the world marking the Holodomor genocide.

Holodomor means "extermination by hunger" in the Ukrainian language. In 1932 and 1933, the Soviet Union's management of agricultural crop production in Ukraine led to a man-made famine, resulting in the

deaths of millions of people through starvation and deprivation. Crops were confiscated and regulations were imposed preventing people from leaving their communities in search of food.

In 2015, an exact reproduction of a statue entitled "Bitter Memories of Childhood" by sculptor Preto Drozdowsky was officially dedicated on the grounds of Wascana Centre. Located southeast of the Legislative Building on Lakeshore Drive, it serves as a permanent reminder of the tragedy.

The Legislative Assembly of Saskatchewan was the first jurisdiction in North America to recognize this genocide with the passing of *The Ukrainian Famine and Genocide (Holodomor) Memorial Day Act* in 2008.

International Holodomor Day is recognized on the fourth Saturday of November and this year falls on November 26, 2022.

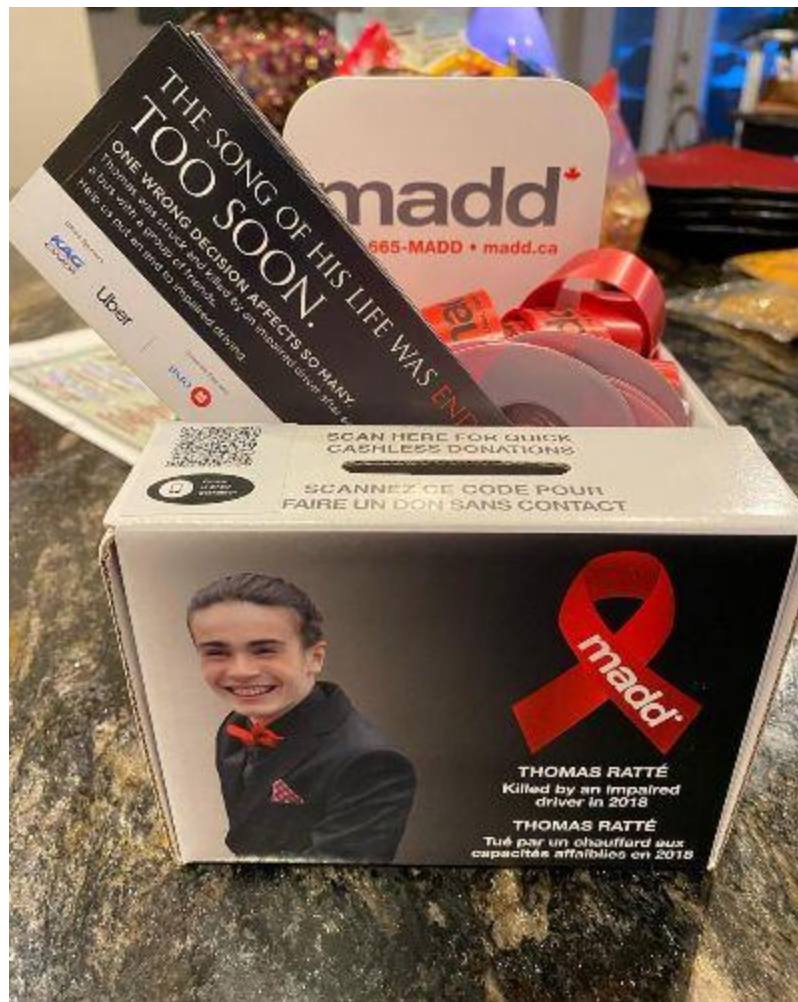

SASKATCHEWAN FUNDS RESEARCH AND INNOVATION OPPORTUNITIES FOR POST-SECONDARY STUDENTS



Saskatchewan post-secondary students are gaining more opportunities to grow their research and innovation skills. In 2022-23, the Government of Saskatchewan is providing \$1.15 million to Mitacs for research internships and additional programming, including the new Indigenous Pathways program.

The funding, an increase of \$600,000, will support up to 265 research and development internships for undergraduate and graduate students and post-doctoral fellows to work in Saskatchewan industries.

"This investment increases opportunities for students to develop and apply their education and research skills while gaining valuable work experience that benefits our industries and province," Advanced Education Minister Gordon Wyant said. "Mitacs supports Saskatchewan's Growth Plan by helping develop a skilled workforce and enhancing business productivity and innovation."

Saskatchewan-based Cameco Corporation has resumed production from its McArthur River mine and Key Lake mill facilities, with Premier Scott Moe and MLA Jim Lemaigre in attendance to celebrate with employees and northern leaders. After announcing plans earlier this year to restart operations, Cameco

recently announced that the first pounds of uranium ore were mined, then milled and packaged for distribution.

"The announcement by Cameco to resume production at its McArthur River mine and Key Lake mill further positions Saskatchewan as a critical and sustainable supplier of fuel and resources the world needs," Premier Scott Moe said. "Congratulations to Cameco on this achievement and for providing over 700 jobs to our province's northerners."

- Shovel snow OVER the boards. When shoveled snow is left against the boards, it turns ice solid, and the volunteer crew is getting too old to shovel hard now. ☁️
- Always leave the place cleaner than you found it. Don't leave garbage and if you see some, please pick it up. There are garbage cans outside and inside the warm-up rink.
- Children and inexperienced skaters should use an approved helmet while on the ice to prevent injuries.

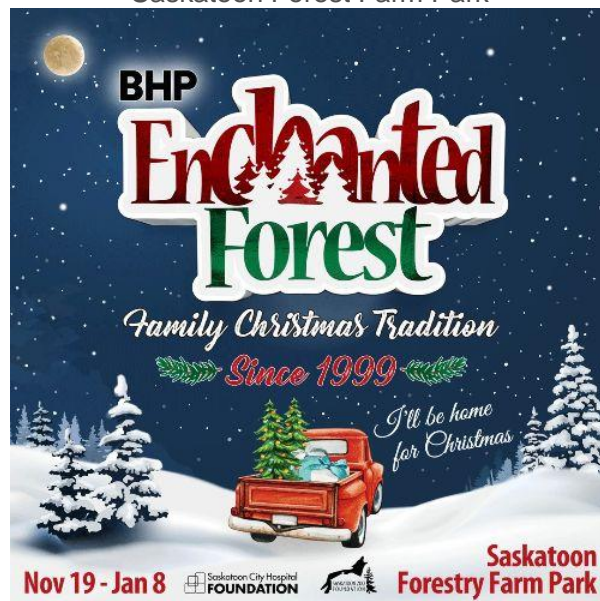

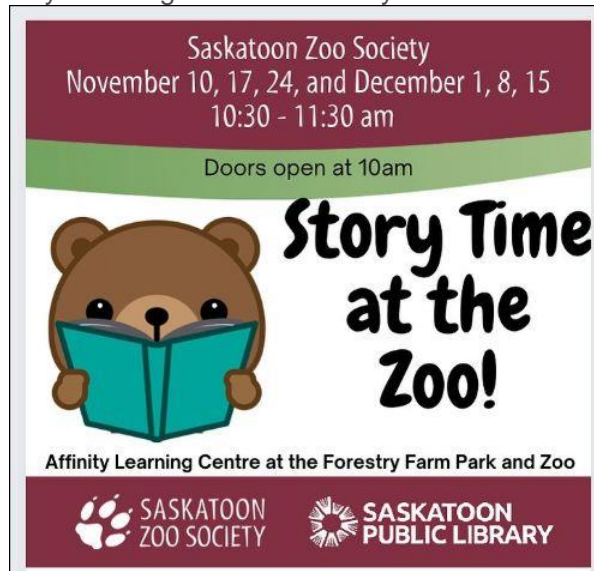
