SASKATCHEWAN LEADS NATION WITH 73.7 PER CENT GROWTH IN WHOLESALE TRADE



Saskatchewan's economy continues to thrive, with Statistics Canada reporting today the value of wholesale trade jumping in our province by 73.7 per cent in August 2022 compared to August 2021, the highest increase among provinces.

The province's manufacturing sales were also up, rising 28.9 per cent from August 2021 to August 2022, ranking Saskatchewan second among provinces.

CHANGES EXTEND PST REBATE FOR NEW HOME CONSTRUCTION



Expanded eligibility for the Provincial Sales Tax (PST) Rebate for New Home Construction will help more people afford new homes.

The rebate now includes homes where a contract has been signed and the property meets new housing start criteria prior to April 1, 2023 - an expansion from the original criteria of occupancy before April 1, 2023.

"Saskatchewan has seen urban housing starts increase by 35.6 per cent in August 2022, compared to August 2021 - the second highest increase among provinces," Deputy Premier and Finance Minister Donna Harpauer said. "We want to ensure the rebate helps Saskatchewan families and individuals afford new homes and helps keep the residential construction industry and our economy strong."

SASKATCHEWAN TO LEAD TRADE AND INVESTMENT MISSION TO MEXICO, ATTEND TRI-NATIONAL AGRICULTURAL ACCORD



Saskatchewan Agriculture Minister David Marit is travelling to Mexico to advance Saskatchewan's interests at trade and investment meetings in Guadalajara, Saltillo and Mexico City.

"Mexico is an important partner for Saskatchewan - especially in agriculture, and we look forward to advancing relationships with key buyers of Saskatchewan crops, cattle and genetics," Marit said. "Through this trade mission we are also working to increase collaboration in other sectors and reduce trade irritants with our neighbours and key trading partners."

The trade mission will include two days of programming in Mexico City to advance the province's trade and investment priorities not only in agriculture, but also critical minerals, oil and gas, and mining sectors. Minister Marit will be supported by the Saskatchewan Mexico Office and by Saskatchewan Trade and Export Partnership (STEP). The Mexico City program will emphasize Saskatchewan's role in a strong, sustainable North American economy as well as provide an opportunity for follow-up with Mexican stakeholders who visited Saskatchewan earlier this year as part of a STEP delegation.

PROCESSOR REPLACEMENT CO-PAY



Beginning December 1:

New co-pay model to help residents replace their cochlear implants

Effective December 1, 2022, Saskatchewan is moving to implement a co-pay model for the Cochlear Implant Program to help residents who need to replace their devices.E

A cochlear implant is a surgically implanted device that processes sound to partially restore hearing. The external processor typically needs to be replaced every five to seven years at a cost of between \$8,000 and \$12,000.

"I've heard from Saskatchewan residents about the role cochlear implants have in improving their ability to communicate with family, friends and colleagues," Health Minister Paul Merriman said. "I'm pleased to announce this expansion, which will ensure that these life-changing devices remain accessible for all our residents."

COMMUNITY RINK AFFORDABILITY GRANT PROGRAM

APPLICATION PERIOD OPENS OCTOBER 17



The Government of Saskatchewan will once again be partnering with the Saskatchewan Parks and Recreation Association (SPRA) in accepting applications from communities for the Community Rink Affordability Grant (CRAG) - committing \$1.7 million to the program for 2022-23.

CRAG provides funding for community-owned indoor skating and curling rinks. In 2021-22, a total of the 594 ice surfaces received funding, including 377 skating rinks and 217 curling rinks.

"Community rinks offer a wide variety of programs year-round that have tremendous benefits for the health and wellbeing of community residents, while also enhancing our quality of life," Parks, Culture and Sport Minister Laura Ross said. "These facilities serve as community hubs for gathering and physical activity across the province. This grant simply helps with costs associated with running these locally owned rinks."


"Our campaign is two-fold this year," says National President, Sandi Lougheed of Beechy, SK.

Starting Monday, October 17, Saskatchewan residents 12 years and older may receive the Pfizer bivalent vaccine through Saskatchewan Health Authority (SHA) booked and walk-in clinics and clinics in First Nation and Métis communities operated by Indigenous Services Canada.

<u>Participating pharmacies</u> are scheduled to start receiving Pfizer bivalent booster doses the week of October 17. Watch for pharmacy appointments to be available later that week.

Starting October 17, all residents 12 - 17 years are eligible for a fourth (booster) dose, if it has been four months since your previous dose.

CANADIAN MENTAL HEALTH ASSOCIATION SASKATCHEWAN WINS AWARD FOR INNOVATIVE PROGRAM






