Books of condolence are now open to the general public to express their sympathies for the passing of Her Late Majesty Queen Elizabeth II.

The locations are as follows:

- Legislative Building (Cumberland Gallery). Public hours for the legislative building are every day from 9am to 5pm.
- Government House in Regina. Public hours for Government House are Tuesday to Sunday from 9am to 4pm.
- Regina City Hall, beginning at noon Friday.
- Saskatoon City Hall, beginning Monday.

A virtual condolence book is also available on the Lieutenant Governor of Saskatchewan's website.

These books will remain in the province and will be placed in the provincial archives once the period of mourning has ended.

SASKATCHEWAN PROCLAIMS DAY TO COMMEMORATE THE LIFE OF QUEEN ELIZABETH THE SECOND



The Government of Saskatchewan has proclaimed Monday, September 19, as a day in tribute and commemoration of Queen Elizabeth II.

"Her late Majesty's seven decades of selfless public service is an honourable legacy," Premier Scott Moe said. "We will pay tribute to her incredible dedication and commemorate her 70-year reign in a memorial service in our capital city - the Queen City."

Books of condolence continue to be available for the public at the Legislative Building, Government House, at City Halls in Regina and Saskatoon, as well as the website of the Lieutenant Governor of Saskatchewan. A memorial service is set for 7 p.m. on September 19, at St. Paul's Anglican Cathedral in Regina. Flags in the province will remain at half-mast for Her late Majesty until sunset on that date.

While September 19 is being proclaimed to honour Queen Elizabeth II, it has not been designated as a provincial public statutory holiday.

IT IS GREAT TO MEET WITH CONSTITUENTS





PREMIER MOE ATTENDS LLOYDMINSTER HEAVY OIL SHOW




Premier Scott Moe, "It was great to join Jason Kenny, Mayor Aalbers, and industry leaders at the Lloydminster Heavy Oil Show.

SASKATCHEWAN RECOGNIZES WORLD SUICIDE PREVENTION DAY



The Government of Saskatchewan recognized September 10, 2022 as World Suicide Prevention Day. Members of the Legislative Assembly are sharing their own experiences so that people who are struggling know that they are not alone, that there is hope and there is help.

"We all have a role to play in supporting our family, friends, and our community through difficult times," MLA for Regina Walsh Acres Derek Meyers said. "Please know that you are not alone, that you are loved, that there is hope, and help is there for you in your time of crisis."

Help is only a phone call away. People who are struggling are encouraged to dial 8-1-1 to speak to a health care professional about the challenges they are experiencing. Healthline 811 is a confidential, 24/7

call-in service staffed by health care professionals who can also help connect you with other supports and services available through Saskatchewan's health care system.

"Losing our daughter to suicide is one of the most difficult things that our family has ever endured," MLA Meyers said. "Teigha's legacy is one of helping others, and with that we carry on each day, working to make Saskatchewan a better place for people struggling with suicidal ideation and other mental health challenges."

The governments of Saskatchewan and Alberta, along with industry stakeholders, have secured a regulation exemption from Ottawa that will allow oil service rigs to move freely between the two provinces.

On June 5, 2019, the premiers of Saskatchewan and Alberta signed a Memorandum of Understanding to help remove provincial barriers to the movement of service rigs.

Since then, they have been urging the federal government to exempt service rigs from regulations under the *Motor Vehicle Transport Act* that prevent vehicles and equipment from moving efficiently between job sites in the two provinces.

"This is long overdue," Premier Scott Moe said. "Western Canadian Energy is not only among the most sustainable in the world, but also among the safest. We should be removing redundant red tape and barriers that impede opportunity for growth."



CROP REPORT FOR THE PERIOD OF SEPTEMBER 6 TO 12, 2022



Ideal conditions over the past week allowed for producers across all regions in the province to make immense progress with harvest. Sixty-four per cent of the crop has now been harvested, up from 42 per cent last week and just ahead of the five-year (2017-2021) average of 57 per cent. An additional 20 per cent of the crop is ready to swath or straight cut. Many producers in the southwest and west-central regions have completed harvest and are on to other field work. There are concerns regarding soil moisture and a good soaking rain post-harvest would be ideal, as soil is drying out across the province after several weeks of minimal precipitation, wind and hot weather.



Harvest is most advanced in the southwest region, where 93 per cent of the crop is in the bin. The west-central has 80 per cent combined, the southeast 57 per cent, the northwest 47 per cent, the east-central 46 per cent and the northeast 41 per cent.

GOVERNMENT INVESTS \$5.4 MILLION FOR INCREASED WAGES FOR EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATORS



The Governments of Saskatchewan and Canada are investing \$5.4 million to provide up to \$2 an hour increase for Early Childhood Educators (ECEs). This is in recognition of the important services they provide in supporting families who require child care. The investment will assist child care centres in providing improved wages in the recruitment and retention of ECEs.

This Wage Enhancement Grant will be funded through the *Canada-Saskatchewan Canada-Wide Early Learning and Child Care Agreement*, which also supports future ECEs with <u>free post-secondary training</u>, professional development opportunities and many other programs. These all align with the joint federal and provincial commitment to improving quality in the early learning and child care sector and attracting, retaining and growing a strong and skilled workforce of Early Childhood Educators.

"Early Childhood Educators provide our youngest learners with quality early learning and the building blocks they need to prepare them for school," Education Minister Dustin Duncan said. "This investment helps recognize the hard work these professionals do every day while creating an incentive for new individuals to begin a career as a certified Early Childhood Educator."
